degrading CECs<sup>[2]</sup>

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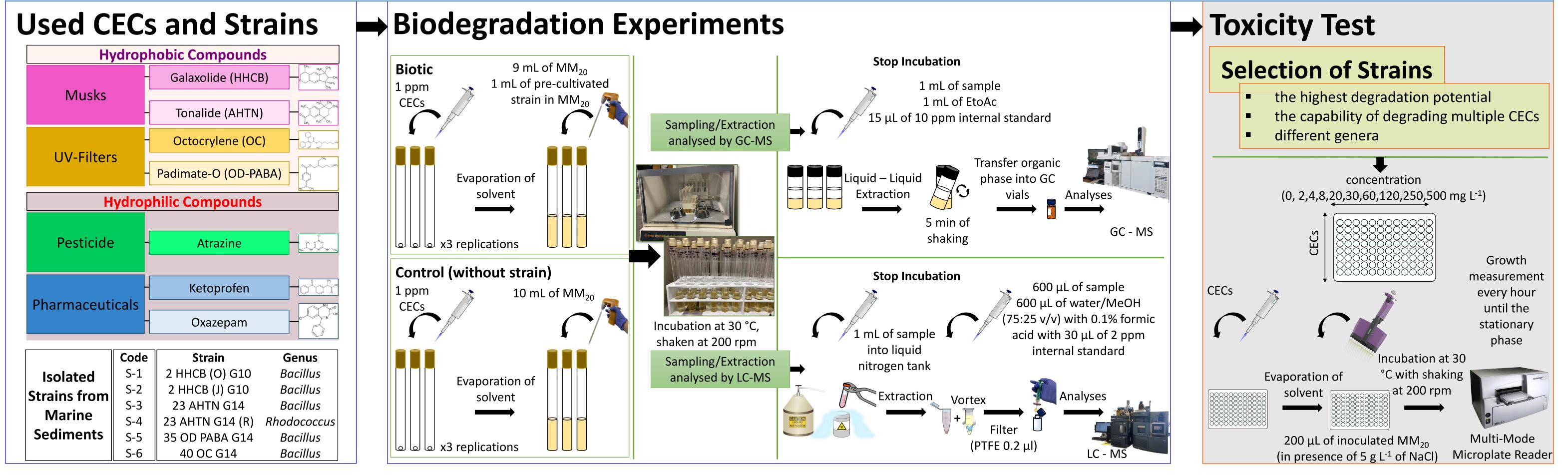
**Fig 1.** The location of sediment sampling sites used isolation of pure bacterial strains, Capbreton Submarine Canyon<sup>[2], [3]</sup>.

• What is the ability of **pure strains isolated from marine sediments** to degrade various **contaminants of emerging concern (CECs)** that have been frequently used in perfumes, personal care products, pharmaceutical industries, and agricultural activities?

 Is there any relationship between their biodegradation potential and resistance?

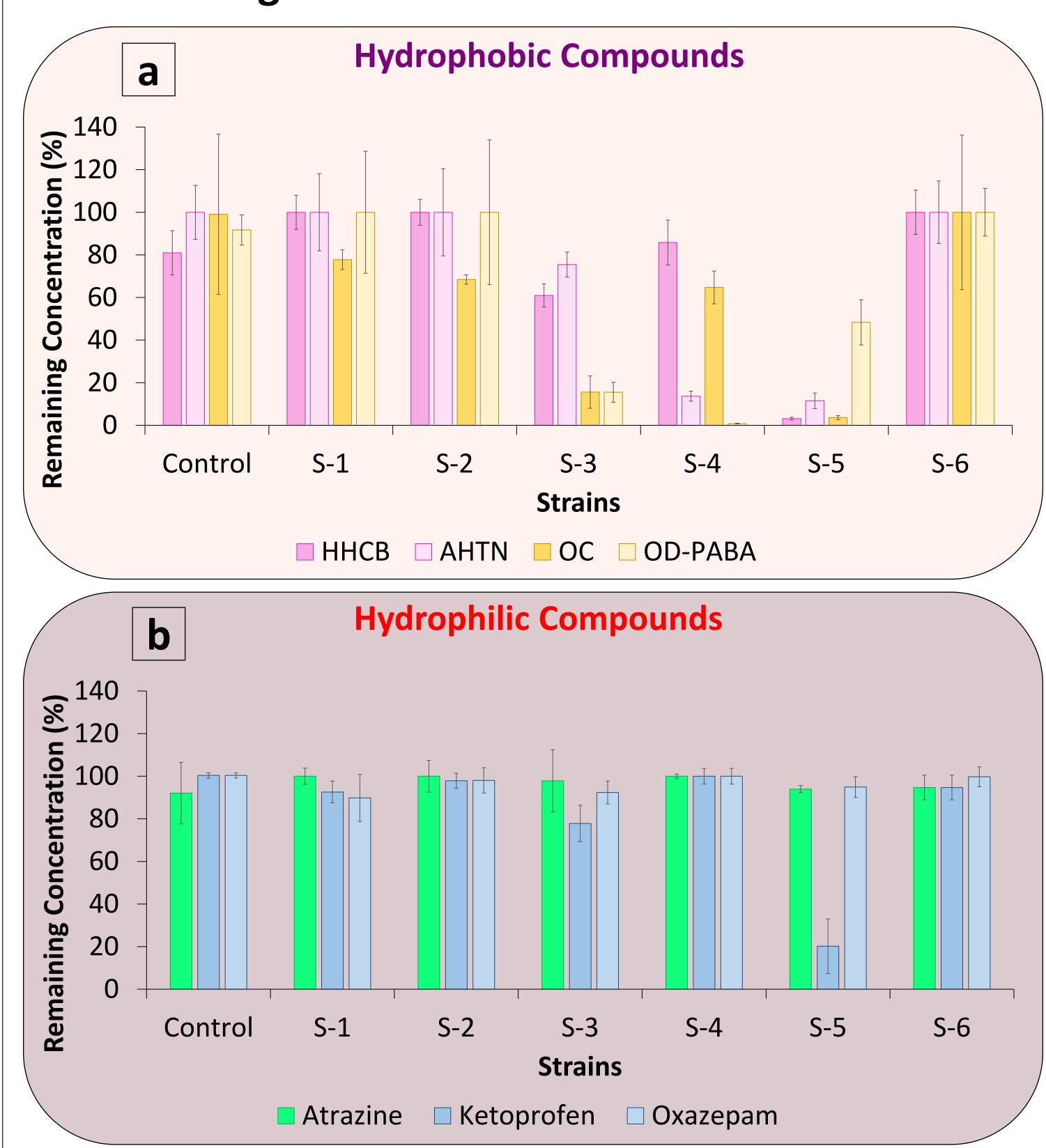

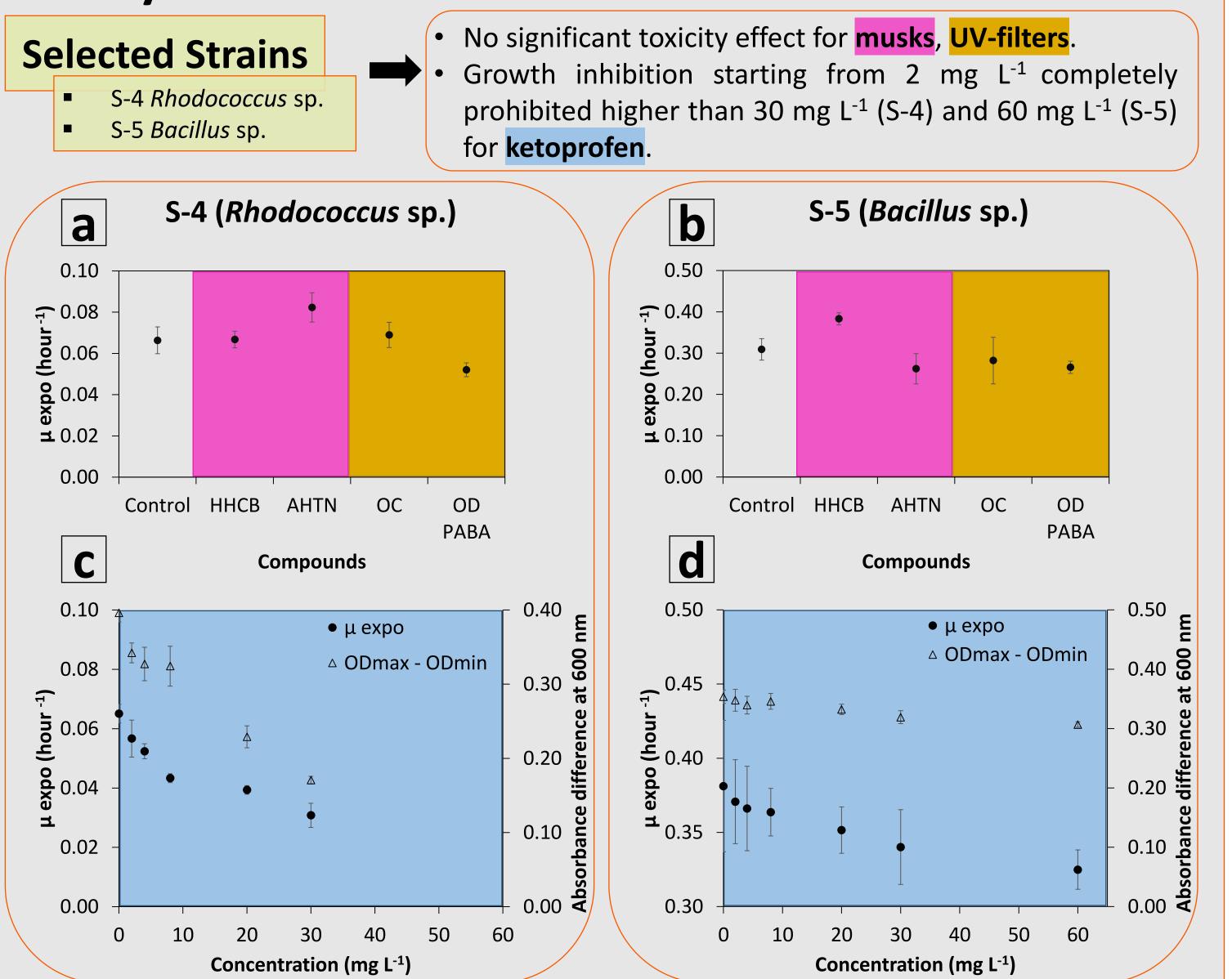

**Fig 2.** Remaining concentration percentage of **hydrophobic (a)** and **hydrophilic (b)** compounds degradation using selected isolated strains. Abiotic control was performed without inoculum in medium  $MM_{20}$ . Initial exposure concentration was 1 mg L<sup>-1</sup>. Data are mean  $\pm$  SD of three replicates.

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**Fig 3.** Exponential growth rate ( $\mu$  expo) (**a** and **b** (Kruskal-Wallis *p* value 0.3223 < 0.05 and 0.5804 < 0.05) in presence of synthetic musks and UV filters at 500 mg L<sup>-1</sup>; **c** and **d** in presence of ketoprofen with production (OD<sub>max</sub> - OD<sub>initial</sub>) measured at 600 nm as a function of concentration by S-4 (**a** and **c**) and S-5 (**b** and **d**). Abiotic control was performed without inoculum in MM<sub>20</sub> medium.

## **Conclusions and Perspectives**

- <u>Efficient</u> degradation of various CECs by pure bacterial strains isolated from marine sediments
- Rapid removal of hydrophobic compounds compared to hydrophilic ones
- <u>No relationship</u> between the resistance capacity and biodegradation potential of the strains
- Need of genomic characterization of strains to identify their genetic involvement in CECs biodegradation
- Promising bacterial strains to study degradation pathways of CECs and to improve biotreatment processes
